1 Thessalonians 2:7-12 (NIV)

⁷ Instead, we were like young children among you. Just as a nursing mother cares for her children, 8 so we cared for you. Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well. 9 Surely you remember, brothers and sisters, our toil and hardship; we worked night and day in order not to be a burden to anyone while we preached the gospel of God to you. 10 You are witnesses, and so is God, of how holy, righteous and blameless we were among you who believed. 11 For you know that we dealt with each of you as a father deals with his own children, ¹² encouraging, comforting and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who calls you into his kingdom and glory.

Forgiveness starts with a mental decision

Forgiveness is not based on others' actions but on our attitude

Forgiveness is a process, not an event

We have to forgive every time

Forgiveness is not letting the offence recur again and again

Forgiveness is returning to God the right to take care of justice

Forgiveness is not letting the offender off the hook

Forgiveness is not the same as reconciling

Forgiveness does not mean forgetting

²⁹ Then I said to you, "Do not be terrified; do not be afraid of them. 30 The Lord your God, who is going before you, will fight for you, as he did for you in Egypt, before your very eyes, 31 and in the wilderness.
